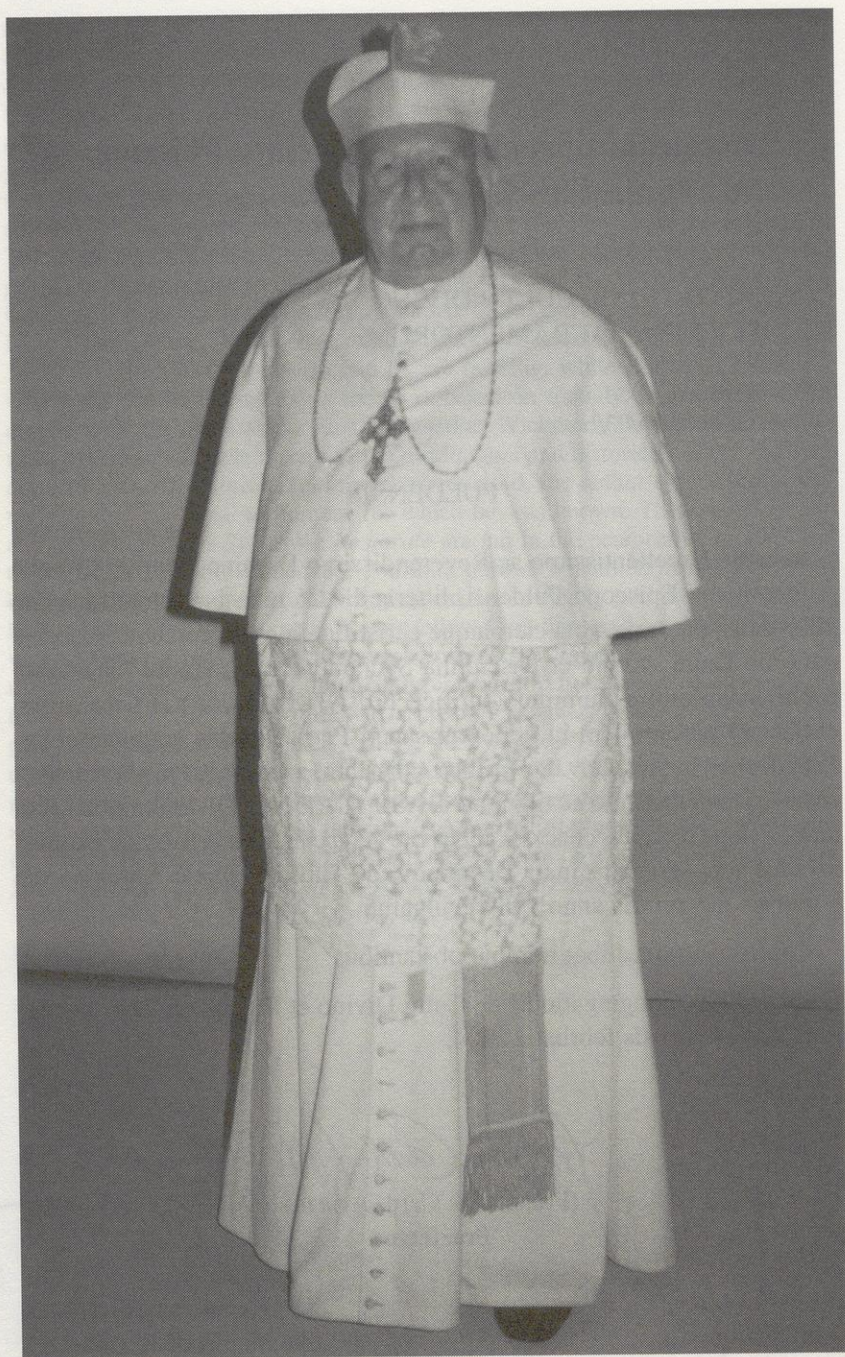

In memoriam Astrik Ladislaus Gabriel (1907-2005),

// A Bio-bibliography

Our confrere, the Rt. Rev. Astrik L. Gabriel, O. Praem., director and professor emeritus in the University of Notre Dame's Medieval Institute, died Monday, May 16, 2005 in Dujarie House at Holy Cross College, South Bend, Indiana. He was 97 years old.

Ladislas Gabriel was born December 10, 1907 in Pécs, Hungary, the eldest son of Aloysius and Maria Boross-Gabriel. On September 11, 1926 he was vested as a novice in the abbey of Jaszo in Czechoslovakia (now Jasov in Slovakia) and given the name Astrik. He was professed on November 13, 1927 and after three years of theological studies was ordained to the priesthood on November 30, 1931. His studies brought him to the University of Budapest (Royal Pázmány Péter University) in 1929 where he studied medieval French literature. From 1932-1936 he attended the École des Hautes Études and the École des Chartes in Paris and in 1936 was awarded the doctorate *summa cum laude* from the University of Budapest. In 1938 he became the founding director of the French College in Gödöllő. In 1941 he was appointed Privat-Dozent and later professor at the University of Budapest. Both positions he held until 1947. Accepting an invitation from Etienne Gilson, Astrik Gabriel spent the academic year 1947-1948 as visiting professor at the Pontifical Institute of Mediaeval Studies in Toronto, Canada. At the end of that year he came to the United States to join the faculty of the recently established Medieval Institute at the University of Notre Dame in Indiana. Here he remained for the rest of his career. He became a naturalized citizen of the United States in 1953 in which year he succeeded to the position of director of the Institute, a position he held until 1975. During his tenure at Notre Dame there were two appointments as a member of the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton (1950-1951 and 1979-1980) and an appointment as the Charles Chauncey Stillman Professor of Roman Catholic Studies at Harvard University (1963-1964). For briefer periods he was a Fulbright exchange professor at the International University of Luxembourg in 1958, at the University of Munich in 1962 and at the University

of Paris in 1967. He lectured at many other European universities: Bochum, Cologne, Freiburg im Breisgau, Louvain, Milan, Oxford, Rome, Stockholm and Vienna. He also lectured at many American colleges and universities. These were in addition to speaking engagements at international congresses, conventions and conferences. Astrik Gabriel's special area of competence was the history of medieval education.

During his long association with the Medieval Institute at Notre Dame its reputation grew and its financial stability was maintained. He built up the University's unique collection of books on the history of medieval education and arranged for the microfilming of the Ambrosian Library of Milan.

Astrik Gabriel's work has been honored and recognized on various occasions by his election to membership or office in several national academies and learned societies as well as by a number of awards. Among these honors was one that he prized greatly. On January 18, 1982 he was made titular abbot of the former St. Michael's Abbey in Budapest by the primate of Hungary. A list of these memberships and honors as well as a list of his works follow. At his death Astrik Gabriel was a member of the Canonry of Gödöllő.
